## **Quickcrop Raised Pond**

## Tools required:

Phillips head screwdriver, or drill and driver bit Measuring tape, pencil Staple gun and staples (optional)

Before beginning construction of your pond, ensure you have cleared a flat surface large enough to accommodate your pond. The ideal base is sand, but a flat surface free from objects that might pierce your liner will suffice

- **1a.** Lay out the side (6ft / 3ft10in) boards [3nr. for 21in, 4nr. for 28in]. Using a measuring tape mark the centre of the top and bottom board to align the centre post to (6ft only).
- **1b.** Position posts at each side (and the centre for a 6ft pond), taking care to align boards neatly. Fix with 5x60mm screws using a screwdriver or drill. Repeat so you have 2 sections.

Tip: Avoid placing the screws too near to the edge of boards to prevent splitting.

- **2.** Fix the end (4ft) boards to the corner posts of the sections completed in step 1 using 5x60mm screws, ensuring the end of the boards sit neatly with the edge of posts. Proceed to the next step once all four corners are secure.
- **3.** Fold the liner into the raised pond base, similar to folding backing parchment into a loaf tin. For additional security you can staple in place using a staple gun.
- **4.** Position the tops of the pond down and screw together through the pre-drilled holes using 4x40mm screws.
- **5.** Fix the top to the base using 5x80mm screws, screwing down through the top, liner and into the post.

Congratulations your pond is now complete! You can now treat if desired using Restol, or a similar water based product. Note that all of our timber is pressure treated and Tanalised.
